EDUCATION GOALS

Education benefits differ depending on whether you serve full-time or part-time. Either way you chose to serve you're automatically enrolled in the Community College of the Air Force. Your college credits add up quickly for Basic Military Training and technical school and can easily lead to an associate's degree in your career field from a regionally accredited institution.

Our commitment to your success is reflected in the diverse education benefits tailored to each type of service. For instance, depending on your service there are multiple GI Bill options:

Post-9/11 GI Bill (Active Duty)

Enlisted members (and some officers) who serve continuously for 36 or more months on active duty may participate in the Montgomery GI Bill-Active Duty (MGIB-AD) program. It provides up to 36 months of financial assistance for education and training expenses and payments are made directly to the student each month. Benefits generally expire 10 years from the last day of active duty.

Montgomery GI Bill-Selected Reserve (Air Force Reserve and Air National Guard)

Air Force Reserve and Air National Guard members who have a six-year service obligation may qualify for the Montgomery GI Bill-Selected Reserve (MGIB-SR) program. The MGIB-SR provides up to 36 months of financial assistance for education and training expenses and payments are made directly to the student each month. Eligibility in this program usually ends the day the individual leaves the Reserve or Guard. There is no monetary contribution required to be eligible for this benefit.
