QUALIFICATIONS

- Be a U.S. citizen
- Be between the ages of 18 and 48
- Graduate with a Doctor of Dental Surgery or a Doctor of Dental Medicine degree from an American Dental Association accredited college or university
- Complete a residency acceptable to the Air Force Surgeon General
- Be fully qualified and have a state license to practice dentistry
- Meet Air Force moral and physical requirements
- Be able to obtain the appropriate security clearance level

HEALTH PROFESSIONS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

If you're currently in dental school or plan to be, you may qualify for the Armed Forces Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP). It covers tuition, fees, books and laboratory expenses. You'll also receive a monthly allowance for living expenses.

When you graduate, you'll have an opportunity to attend the one-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry (AEGD)-1 residency program at no cost to you. AEGD-1 is designed to expand the scope and depth of your knowledge and skills and enable you to provide comprehensive patient care to a wide range of population groups.

Upon completion of the residency, you'll owe the Air Force a minimum active-duty obligation of three years or one year for each year of your HPSP scholarship (whichever is greater). If you're not enrolled in the AEGD-1, your active-duty commitment will begin after you graduate from dental school. See your recruiter for more information on the HPSP.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

Throughout your career the Air Force Continuing Education program will help you stay up-to-date on current trends, new dental innovations, and procedures. We offer multiple residencies and postdoctoral fellowships.
