Working within the space domain, our Guardians launch rockets, maneuver satellites to keep them safe and operational, protect the cyber frontier and develop new technology to defend our nation, our allies and our way of life on Earth.

THE SPACE DOMAIN

On September 1, 1982, the Air Force began guarding our satellites and communication systems under the management of the Air Force Space Command. That changed 37 years later on December 20, 2019, when the Space Force was established as the sixth branch of the armed services.

The establishment of the Space Force resulted from the realization that space has become a contested environment. Important to our national security, it became clear there was a need for a military service focused solely on protecting our space systems from our adversaries.

To maintain our access to space and ensure our security, we must have continuous situational awareness and complete understanding of both the environmental effects and actions of all nations that operate in space.



OUR MISSION

The Space Force is responsible for organizing, training and equipping Guardians to conduct global space operations that enhance the way our joint and coalition forces fight, while also offering decision-makers military options to achieve national objectives.

LEAN AND AGILE FORCE

The Space Force is a lean and agile force by design, focused on being a truly digital service. The importance of every Guardian's contribution and commitment to serve is heightened by the need to protect the American way of life.

ENEMY THREATS

Space is no longer free from conflict and is the most technically challenging of all the warfighting domains. Although the U.S. military is faster, better connected, more informed, precise and lethal because of our space assets, our adversaries continually seek ways to deny us access to the space capabilities that are fundamental to our way of war and modern way of life. They have developed an array of threats, both on Earth and in orbit, that continue to grow in scope, scale and complexity.

SPACE LIFT AND SATELLITE OPERATIONS

Satellites are essential to secure communications, weather observations and navigational data for ground, air and naval fleet operations both near and far.

Through the command and control of all defense satellites, Guardians provide force-multiplying effects—global surveillance, decreased operational risk and 24/7 flawless coverage.

Space lift operations at our east and west coast launch locations provide services, facilities and range safety control for the Department of Defense, NASA and commercial space launches.

WARNING SYSTEMS

Ground-based and space-based systems monitor ballistic missile launches around the world to guard America and its allies against missile attacks. Furthermore, a global network of space surveillance sensors provide vital information on the location of satellites and space debris for our nation and the world.





DAILY LIFE TECHNOLOGY

Space capabilities are woven into the fabric of our daily lives. Satellites connect more than 4 billion people around the globe. They monitor weather patterns, carry television broadcasts, and the timing and navigation services of the GPS constellation power global financial networks, enable international commerce, synchronize cell phone networks and optimize critical infrastructure such as our power grids.

Our Guardians constantly monitor more than three dozen commercial satellite constellations, track more than 27,000 objects circling Earth and issue warnings to maneuver satellites into safe orbits to avoid collision. Guardians work hard every day to keep the space domain safe and accessible so the world never has to experience a day without space capabilities.
