Lt. Colonel Tanner A. Allshouse is the Commandant for the Air Force's Warrant Officer Training School under the Jeanne M. Holm Center for Officer Accessions and Citizen Development at Maxwell Air Force Base, Montgomery, Alabama. He is responsible for the comprehensive management of schoolhouse operations, training, and professional development for 150 candidates annually. He leads the development of highly skilled warfighting advisors, prepared to integrate technical and specialized expertise across the spectrum of strategic competition.

He commissioned in May 2011 as a Reserve Officer Training Corps graduate from George Mason University in Fairfax, Va. He has served in a variety of positions at the squadron and group levels. Lt. Allshouse served previously as Squadron Officer School's Deputy Director of Future Plans where he was responsible for over 3,200 Department of the Air Force Company Grade Officers, DoD Civilians and International Officers annually on their professional growth and development. Prior to his current position, he was the Director of Operations at the Warrant Officer Training School.



Lt. Colonel Allshouse has deployed to Al Udeid Air Base, Qatar and Bagram Air Field, Afghanistan in support of Operations Resolute Support, Enduring Freedom, Freedom's Sentinel and Inherent Resolve, accumulating more than 1,100 combat hours. Furthermore, he has flown in support of Northern and Southern Command operations against counter-drug operations. Previously, he has flown both the T-6A Texan the T-1 Jayhawk, E-8C Joint Surveillance Target Attack Radar System and the EC-130H Compass Call.
